




The Comisión Nacional de Hidrocarburos (CNH or Commission) has as two of its strategic objectives to ensure the continuous improvement of the regulation of exploration and extraction of hydrocarbons, as well as to ensure efficient and quality attention to the regulated entities.

Taking into consideration these objectives, the CNH takes the regulation as an effective tool to accompany the growth of all factors in the energy sector based on the following strategy:

The impact of the transversal modification for each area of opportunity detected is summarized as:

Plan Guidelines

Reduction of administrative costs

- The presentation of the Work Program and Budget for the Assignees is eliminated.
- Reduction of attention periods of the Plan and Programs.
- · Simplification of requirements.
- Flexibility in cases of modification of Development Plans.
- Training and technology transfer.

Well Guidelines

Benefit	\$ 1,060 millions

- New regulations according to drilling activities.
- Request for drilling of wells at the same time that the Plan or Program.
- Reduction of paperwork.
- Reduction of resolution periods for wells in deep and ultra-deep water.
- Elimination of V Annex.
- Elimination of the modification for the drilling authorization.

Gas Use Guidelines

- Simplification of the utilization program.
- Simplification of formats.
- Revocation of Annexes I and II.
- Homologation of the obligation related to the use of associated natural gas and non-associated natural gas.
- Elimination of the adjustment to the achievement goal.

Measurement Guidelines

- Elimination of the annual measurement report.
- Simplification of formats.
- Clarification of the assumptions to present the provisional measurement point proposal.
- Clarification of the assumptions of modification of measurement mechanisms.



- The provisions for secondary or improved recovery processes to form part of the development plan are abrogated.
- The obligation to present results of the biannual technical and economic review is eliminated.
- Monitoring of tests with quarterly and final reports
- Process performance indicators.

Reserves Guidelines

 The guidelines were modified so that the regulation issued by the Commission is consistent with respect to the incorporation of reserves from the favorable pronouncement of the Evaluation, Pilot or Transition Program, or from the presentation of the evaluation report.

The changes in the regulatory improvement will make it possible to ensure greater efficiency and effectiveness in exploration and extraction projects by meeting the strategic objectives of the CNH, in which regulation is seen as a factor to maximize the value of hydrocarbons, and not only as an administrative procedure, in order to promote investment and economic growth.
